Just a friendly reminder to keep our community clean and enjoyable for everyone:


- Fishing in the ponds within Key Vista is strictly prohibited. Let's respect the rules to maintain a serene environment.



QUICK & EASY RECIPES





RASPBERRY JAM COCKTAIL

Ingredients

- 4 Raspberries or a tbsp of Raspberry Jam
- 45ml vodka
- Schweppes Lemon Lime & Bitters
- 2 tsp caster sugar
- Ice

Instructions

- Combine four raspberries and caster sugar in a sturdy glass, crush to a paste with a wooden spoon.
- Fill with ice, then add vodka and stir to combine.
- Top with Schweppes Lemon Lime & Bitters, stir once more to combine and serve!

CREAMY CHICKEN FLORENTINE (One Pan)

Ingredients

- 1 tbsp Extra Virgin Olive Oil
- 4 Chicken Breast Fillets
- 3 Garlic Cloves, thinly sliced
- 1/3 cup Dry White Wine
- 1 tbsp Dijon Mustard
- 2 cups Chicken Stock
- 11/2 cups Boiling Water
- 11/2 cups Linquine
- 1 cup Thickened Cream
- Baby Spinach

Instructions

- Heat oil in a round frying pan over high heat. Season chicken with salt and pepper. Add chicken to pan. Cook for 4 to 5 minutes each side or until well browned and cooked through. Transfer to a plate. Cover loosely with foil.
- Add garlic to pan. Cook for 30 seconds. Add wine and mustard. Boil for 1 minute, scraping base of pan, or until wine has reduced by half. Add stock and water. Bring to the boil. Add pasta. Stir well. Cook, covered, for 10 minutes, stirring every 2 minutes (scrape base of pan to make sure pasta doesn't stick) or until pasta is just tender.
- Add cream and spinach to pan. Stir until well combined. Add chicken and resting juices to pan. Season with salt and pepper. Cook for 2 minutes or until spinach just starts to wilt. Drizzle with extra cream. Serve!





DID YOU KNOW?



- Did you know that octopuses are master escape artists? These incredible cephalopods have been known to escape from aquarium tanks, solve puzzles to obtain food, and even mimic the appearance of other marine animals. With their intelligence and problem-solving abilities, octopuses continue to surprise researchers and aquarium enthusiasts alike.
- Archaeologists have discovered pots of honey in ancient Egyptian tombs that are over 3,000 years old and still perfectly edible. Honey's unique composition, low water content, and natural acidity create an environment that resists bacteria and spoilage.
- The Anglo-Zanzibar War of 1896 holds the record for the shortest war in history, lasting a mere 38 minutes. The conflict arose over the succession of the Sultan of Zanzibar, and when negotiations failed, the British launched a swift attack. By the time the dust settled, the war was over, leaving an interesting footnote in the annals of military history.
- In botanical terms, bananas qualify as berries, while strawberries do not. True berries develop from a single ovary, and bananas fit this definition. On the other hand, strawberries, with their seeds on the outer skin, are classified as aggregate fruits.
- Due to thermal expansion, the Eiffel Tower can expand and contract with temperature changes. During hot summer days, the iron structure can expand, causing the tower to grow by as much as 6 inches.
- The Great Emu War: In 1932, Australia experienced a peculiar conflict known as the Great Emu War. Faced with an overpopulation of emus damaging crops, the Australian government deployed soldiers armed with machine guns to control the emu population. Despite their efforts, the emus proved to be elusive, and the military's "war" against the flightless birds ended in a comical defeat.
- The blue whale, the largest animal on Earth, has a heart that can weigh as much as a car. This incredible mammal's heart is so massive that a small child could theoretically crawl through its arteries!
- Cows are social animals that form close bonds with others in their herd. They have been observed forming strong friendships and becoming stressed when separated from their best buddies. Just like humans, cows enjoy the company of their closest friends.
- The Dancing Plague of 1518: In Strasbourg, France, in 1518, a strange phenomenon occurred known as
 the Dancing Plague. Hundreds of people began dancing uncontrollably in the streets, and the bizarre
 episode continued for weeks. The cause of this mass dance hysteria remains a mystery to this day.
- The axolotl, a salamander native to Mexico, is known for its remarkable ability to regenerate body parts.

 Not only can it regrow limbs, but it can also regenerate parts of its heart, brain, and spinal cord. This unique feature has made the axolotl a subject of fascination for scientists studying regeneration.
- Bubble wrap, the popular packaging material, was initially invented in 1957 as a textured wallpaper. However, it didn't find success in that role. It wasn't until later that its use as protective packaging material took off, becoming a staple in shipping and packaging industries.

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
